Program Goals

- ❖ Gain new insight and awareness on compartment syndromes for the abdomen and other regions
- ❖ Survey and recognize the challenges of diagnosis and management in torso venous injuries
- ❖ Understand how to evaluate and treat traumatic brain injury associated with coagulopathy
- ❖ Gain new information on the pathophysiology and treatment of bomb blast injuries
- ❖ Examine the collaborative interaction between EMS, emergency medicine, critical care, and trauma services
- ❖ Learn how to manage complicated wounds in trauma
- ❖ Understand key factors when seeking publication and what prospective authors need to know about authorship and transparency
- ❖ Define what is definitive care for the injured patient
