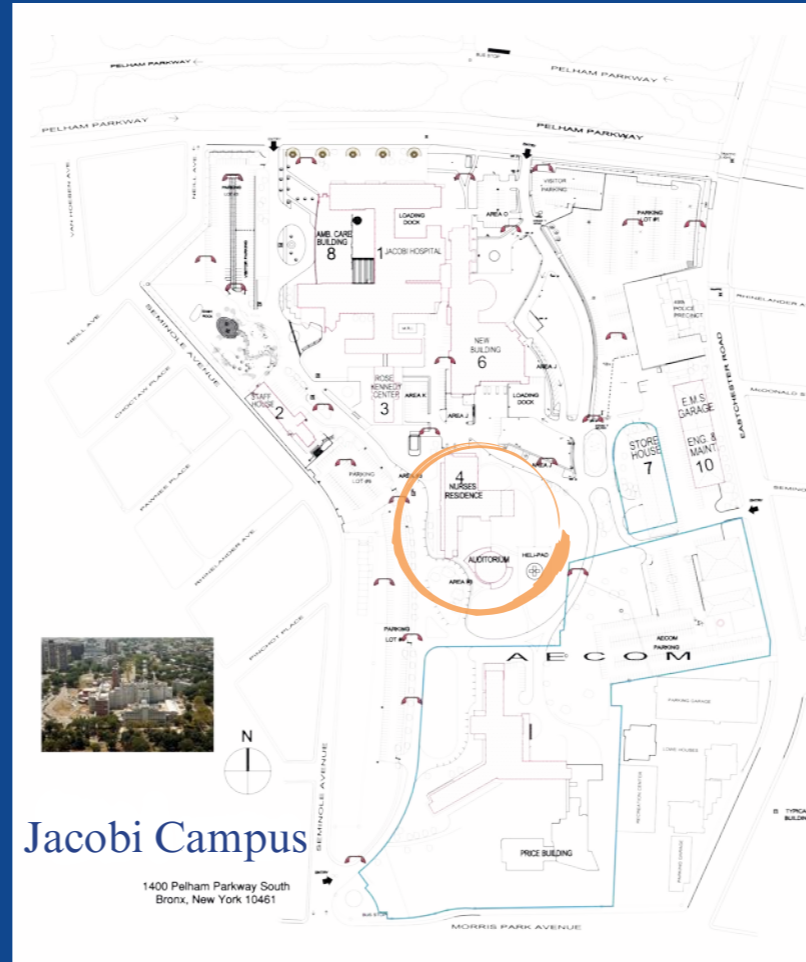
On campus guest parking is very limited. The use of public transportation is **strongly** recommended.
